Walmer Bridge Day Nursery is a privately owned Nursery situated in the original village Primary School, which dates back to the 1800's. It is set in a lovely rural village with close commuter links to the city of Preston and Liverpool. We are open from 07.30 – 18.00 hrs, 52 weeks of the year, only closing for bank holidays. We are registered with Ofsted for 59 children.

At Walmer Bridge Day Nursery, we have a dedicated, caring staff team committed to enabling every child to achieve his/her best. This is achieved when both the nursery and the parents work in partnership. We therefore encourage parent's involvement in nursery life and offer many opportunities for parents to support activities within the nursery such as fund raising events and parent information evenings.

In order to secure a place for your child at Walmer Bridge Nursery we ask for a £25.00 non-refundable deposit. With this you receive a Walmer Bridge Day Nursery Sweatshirt for your child.

ADMISSIONS POLICY

Early Education and Childcare Entitlement at Walmer Bridge Day Nursery

Our nursery is offering the government's funded early education and childcare entitlement. The scheme offers 570 hours per year (the equivalent of 15 hours a week over 38 weeks) for some two-year-olds and all three-and four-year-olds.

From September 2017 an additional 570 hours per year (i.e a total 1,140 hours a year, the equivalent of 30 hours per week over 38 weeks), will be available for qualifying three-and four-year-olds with working parents who meet the government's eligibility criteria.

Early education and childcare entitlement places are funded by government. Funding for places is allocated by central government to the local authority. The local authority then uses this money to fund places at the nursery.

The hourly rate for places received by the nursery is decided by the local authority and rates are below the usual fees nurseries charge for their places.

What to Expect.

The funded early education and childcare entitlement is intended to deliver free, high-quality, flexible childcare. However, it does not include the costs of meals, other consumables, additional hours or additional services. In our setting we provide children with 3 balanced and nutritious meals a day. All meals are cooked fresh daily by our cook who creates imaginative meals from locally sourced producers.

Our nursery will charge for meals and snacks, consumables and optional activities. Whilst taking up your child's funded entitlement place cannot be made conditional on you paying for these additional services, our nursery is free to set its own admissions criteria.

Support with Childcare Costs

You can visit the Childcare Choices website to check with childcare costs that may be available to you. This website includes details of the eligibility criteria for 30 hours childcare. Terms and Contractual Conditions

- The Nursery is open 52 Weeks of the year, excluding bank holidays.
- You do not pay for bank holidays Mondays. Full week care is charged at a daily rate for the weeks shortened by a bank holiday.
- The Nursery opens at 7:30 and closes at 6:00pm prompt.
- Fees are payable for the week on the first day of attendance.
- We ask for four weeks written notice or payment of fees in lieu if you wish to take your child out
 of the nursery.
- Parents must notify staff if someone other than notified persons is picking their child up from nursery to prevent any misunderstanding, as the child will NOT be released them unless prior permission is given.
- If a child is unwell in our care every effort is made to contact the parents.
- Parents must try to contact the nursery before 10.00am if their child will not be attending nursery that day.
- A fine of £10 for every 15 minutes will be charged for late collection of children.
- Photographs of the children may be taken unless carers have requested other wise on enrolment form.
- The children's records are kept in the office and are only accessible by specific members of staff, all staff are aware if confidentiality.
- Full fees are due for all contracted days when a child is temporarily for any reason, including sickness. You do receive 2 weeks of half fees each year commencing from the date your child starts nursery and running yearly thereafter. Two weeks notice is needed for the use of half fees.
- The Nursery policy documents are displayed on the notice board in the entrance hall and parents are requested to read the following policies without exception. Safeguarding, Equal Opportunities, Complaints Procedure, Lost Child Procedure and Uncollected Child Procedure.
- Fee's are reviewed every year with an increase in September.

We will only use your personal information to provide a childcare service to you. We'd like to send
you information about child/our nursery by email/Facebook/phone but we need to be sure we have
your permission to do so. We keep your information so you can receive important updates about
your child/our nursery. We will keep your information secure and will never share it except if
required to do so by law.


